BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Supervisor or the Deputy Supervisor be, and are hereby authorized, to sign all the necessary documents for the financing of the Town of Westfield."

Resolution No. 7 of 2017

Highway Agreement

RESOLVED, that pursuant to the provisions of Section 284 of the Highway Law, the Town Board agrees that monies levied and collected for the repair and improvement of highways, and received from the state for the repair and improvement of highways, and specifically the sum of \$170,000 shall be expended for the general repairs of town highways, including sluices, culverts and bridges, or the renewal thereof, and for the following projects:

- 1. The oiling and stoning within the budget allotment of portions of the following roads: (Rogerville (1.36); Hardscrabble (1.5); Culver (.41); Klondike (.7); Mt Baldy (1.5). Total mileage is 5.47
- 2. Should the Town receive funds under the Consolidated Highway Improvement Project System (CHIPS),

funds estimated in the 2017Budget (\$128,036.00) would be used towards re-blacktopping Third Street, (1000 feet) Ogden (1.5 mile), Putnam (.85 mile) Terrace street (500 feet).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that no fewer than three members of the Town Board and the Highway Superintendent shall execute a certified copy of this resolution in duplicate, and said certified copy, so signed, shall constitute written agreement between the parties once it shall have been approved by the County Superintendent of Highways.

Reduction of speed limit on Titus Road

WHEREAS, at the request of the Chautauqua County Department of Public Facilities and the Town of Sherman, the New York State Department of Transportation (NYSDOT) has recently completed a traffic engineering investigation related to a request for a reduced speed limit on Titus Road between Route 76 and Route 430.

WHEREAS, based on the data collected and speed zone evaluation criteria, NYSDOT has determined that a speed limit of 45 PMH would be appropriate for this portion of Titus Road.

Resolved, that the Town of Westfield is in agreement with the establishment of a 45 PMH speed limit on Titus Road from Route 76 to Route 430.
