#### **Pledge of Allegiance**

Councilmember David Brown made the motion to waive the reading of the July 10, 2024, minutes inasmuch as all members received a copy thereof and the minutes be accepted. Councilmember David Spann seconded the motion. The motion was carried unanimously.

#### **Reports:**

The Supervisor's July monthly report was distributed and accepted as submitted including up to date spending and revenues on all accounts. All board members have received a copy, and the monthly report is always available in the Supervisor's office for anyone to view. Quarterly sales tax was received, reviewing years' worth of sales tax received as every year is different. The bank interest is at 5.32 %. The Supervisor's office is working on the 2025 budget.

The Town Clerk's report together with a check in the amount of \$13,192.42 totaling representing fees for the month of July 2024 is turned over to the Supervisor. A check for \$315.00 representing fees for the month of July to NYS Department of Health for Marriage Licenses. The amount of \$58.00 has been turned over to NYS Department of Agriculture and Markets and NYS Decals licenses in the amount of \$75.58 will be withdrawn on the 13<sup>th</sup>. Decals license sales started August 1<sup>st</sup>. The office is educating the community as the license has changed, the license is printed on letter sized plain paper and or emailed to the license holder. The Town Clerk is working with NCCR regarding recycling. Plans to meet with NCCR to discuss current agreement. More information will be forthcoming.

**WHEREAS**, Jack's Welding Service, Inc., of Westfield, New York, submitted a bid of \$85,680.00 with no substantial variances from the bid specifications, and appears to be a responsible bidder,
